A motion was made by Commissioner Okoren and seconded by Commissioner Falan to approve the minutes from the regular meeting of June 22, 2016, as presented. Roll call on the motion: Commissioner Falan, yes; Commissioner Haase, yes; Commissioner Okoren, yes. Motion unanimously approved.

Public Comment: Mr. Smith presented a petition signed by surrounding property owners for the Board to consider upgrades and improvements to 28 ¾ Road. Mr. Cooper stated that participation from Haring Township or other sources would be required.

## New Business:

A motion was made by Commissioner Falan and seconded by Commissioner Okoren to accept the proposal from Berthiaume & Company for audit services through 2018. Roll call on the motion: Commissioner Okoren, yes; Commissioner Haase, yes; Commissioner Falan, yes. Motion unanimously approved.

A motion was made by Commissioner Falan and seconded by Commissioner Okoren to accept the 2016 2<sup>nd</sup> Qtr. Financial reports presented by Ms. Herman. Roll call on the motion: Commissioner Haase, yes; Commissioner Falan, yes; Commissioner Okoren, yes. Motion unanimously approved.

A motion was made by Commissioner Okoren and seconded by Commissioner Falan to award the bid for the production of processed aggregate in the Watson and Meauwataka pits to Halliday Sand and Gravel. Roll call on the motion: Commissioner Falan, yes; Commissioner Okoren, yes; Commissioner Haase, yes. Motion unanimously approved.

Ms. Herman informed the Board that the 2014 MDOT Audit was complete and Commission Audit is starting on the 2015 MDOT Audit.

Ms. Herman stated that the 457 conversion with Empower is going well.

Mr. Hurlburt stated that they were working on gravelling projects in Clam Lake and Selma Townships and were almost done on the USFS project on 31 Rd.

Mr. Patnode informed the Board that Alcona County Road Commission purchased the durapatcher and the crackfiller sold at auction for \$11,830.00, higher than anticipated

Mr. Cooper informed the Board that the DNR met with CRA President Denise Donahue yesterday to discuss Senator Casperson's bill to not require permits for loggers.

Mr. Cooper informed the Board that there was no movement on the Fagerman's case.

Mr. Cooper updated the Board on the 15 Rd. survey for abandonment (Dean Jurik).

Mr. Cooper stated that he had not heard from Pat's Place or Burton's Landing on their intent to proceed with abandonment.

Mr. Haase stated that the crew is doing a good job on brining.

Mr. Okoren stated that on logging projects, the Feds would stop a road from being punched out where the State won't.
